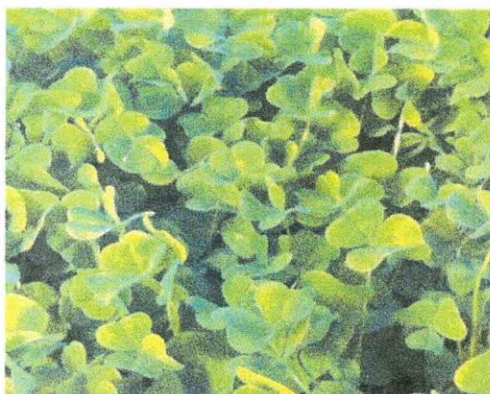


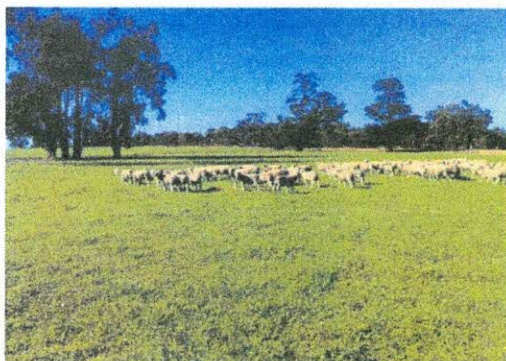


Dalkeith Subterranean Mix Clover at Melchiorre Seeds

Subterranean clover is the most commonly sown pasture legume that is grown annually. Typical growing season is autumn, winter and early spring. There are many advantages of growing a sub clover and with a self pollinating good seed set it allows for regeneration each year.



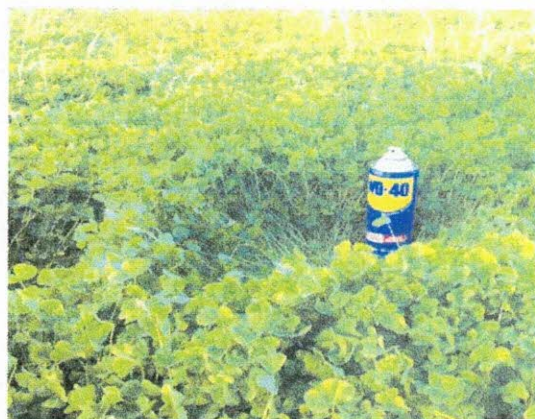
Having a range of different varieties in the mixture ensures a measure of protection from false breaks and early finishing seasons. Depending on the season the more adaptable variety in the mix will be the better performer. The Melchiorre Dalkeith mix fits this criteria perfectly



By establishing your pastures with a sub clover it provides sheep a source of feed without having to provide expensive supplement grain or pellets. It also will help turn off fat lambs in spring with nil hand feeding, something that we have been achieving for many years on the pastures photographed below.

Another positive planting a sub clover is it puts a high amount of nitrogen back into your soil therefore helps reduce the costs of fertilizer at seeding time.

With the wide range of chemicals available to manipulate sub clover pasture we can now economically take out competitive weeds and set up quality pasture eliminating grass seed problems, V.M in wool and have a clean paddock to crop the following year. A win win situation that can only put money in the bank and reduce work load in the busy times.
